

Section 7

Hotel Tariff

The rates H.1, H. 2 and H.3 set out below shall be applicable to a supply of electricity used in hotels but shall not be applicable to a supply of electricity covered under Section 8 of this schedule.

Rate H-1

- (a) This rate shall apply to supplies at each individual point of supply delivered and metered at 400/230 Volts nominal and where the contract demand is less than 42kVA.
- (b) The charges in each billing period for supplies under this tariff shall be the sum of charges (i) and (ii) given below : -
  - (i) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 11.40 per unit.
  - (ii) A fixed charge of Rs. 30.00 per billing period if the contract demand is 10kVA or below and a fixed charge of Rs. 230.00 if the contract demand is above 10kVA but less than 42kVA.

Rate H-2

- (a) This rate shall apply to supplies at each individual point of supply delivered and metered at 400/230 Volts nominal and where the contract demand is equal to or exceeds 42kVA.
- (b) The charges in each billing period for supplies under this tariff shall be the sum of charges (i), (ii) and (iii) given below : -
  - (i) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 11.30 per unit.
  - (ii) A maximum demand charge at the rate of Rs. 500.00 per KVA of the maximum demand made during a billing period,
  - (iii) A fix charge of Rs. 800.00 per billing period.

Rate H-3

- (a) This rate shall apply to supplies at each individual point of supply delivered and metered at 11,000 Volts nominal and above.
- (b) The charges in each billing period for supplies under this tariff shall be the sum of charge (i), (ii) and (iii) given below :—
  - (i) a unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 11.20 per unit,
  - (ii) A Maximum Demand Charge at the rate of Rs. 480.00 per KVA of the maximum demand made during a billing period,
  - (iii) A fix charge of Rs. 800.00 per billing period.

Section 8

Hotel Time of Day Tariff

The rate H.2 (T.D) and H.3 (T.D) set out below shall be applicable to a supply of electricity at each individual point of supply used in hotels. These rates H.2 (T.D) and H.3 (T.D) are applicable to a supply of electricity for Hotel Consumers where Ceylon electricity Board and the consumer mutually agree to one of these optional rates in lieu of the corresponding rates H.2 and H.3 described in the Section 7 of this notice, The General Manager, Ceylon Electricity Board shall take into consideration the time taken for procurement of suitable metering equipment and other factors, determine at his discretion the date from which the relevant rate shall become effective in respect of each supply on the case by case basis.

Rate H-2 (T.D)

- (a) This rate shall apply to supplies at each individual point of supply delivered and metered at 400/230 Volts nominal and where the contract demand is equal to or exceeds 42kVA.
- (b) The charges in each billing period for supplies under this tariff shall be the sum of charge (i), (ii) (iii) and (iv) given below :—

- (i) A maximum demand charge at the rate of Rs. 480.00 per kVA of the maximum demand made during a billing period,
- (ii) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 9.60 per unit for units consumed within the hours from 10.00 p.m. to 7.00 p.m. the following day,
- (iii) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 22.80 per unit for units consumed in the hours from 7.00 p.m. to 10.00 p.m. each day,
- (iv) A fix charge of Rs. 800.00 per billing period.

#### Rate H-3 (T.D)

- (a) This rate shall apply to supplies at each individual point of supply delivered and metered at 11,000 Volts nominal and above.
- (b) The charges in each billing period for supplies under this tariff shall be the sum of charge (i), (ii) (iii) and (iv) given below :—
  - (i) A maximum demand charge at the rate of Rs. 460.00 per kVA of the maximum demand made during a billing period,
  - (ii) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 9.40 per unit for units consumed within the hours from 10.00 p.m. to 7.00 p.m. the following day,
  - (iii) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 22.00 per unit for units consumed in the hours from 7.00 p.m. to 10.00 p.m. each day,
  - (iv) A fix charge of Rs. 800.00 per billing period.

### Section 9

#### Standby Supply Tariff

- (a) Electricity supplied on a standby basis shall apply to industrial consumers where the Ceylon Electricity Board and the consumer mutually agree to one of these optional rates in lieu of the corresponding rates 1.2 and 1.3m in Section 5 of this Notice, The General Manager, Ceylon Electricity Board shall, taking into consideration the time taken for procurement of suitable metering equipment and other factors, determine at his discretion the date from which the relevant rate shall be applicable to each supply of electricity on a case by case basis.
- (b) The rates 1.2 (ST) and 1.3 (ST) set out below be applicable to a supply of electricity on a standby basis, at each individual point of supply used wholly or mainly for motive power or for electro-chemical processes in factories, workshops, foundries, oil mills, spinning and weaving mills, water supply and irrigation pumping stations, port and dock installations and other similar industrial installations.
- (c) The standby tariff is applicable only when the energy consumed from the CEB supply does not exceed 15% of the consumer's estimated consumption in a billing period.

#### Rate I.2 (S.T)

- (a) This rate shall apply to supplies on standby basis at each individual point of supply delivered and metered at 400/230 Volts nominal and where the contract demand is equal or to exceeds 42 kVA.
- (b) The charges in each billing period for supplies under this tariff shall be the sum of charge (i), (ii) and (iii) given below :—
  - (i) A demand charge at the rate of Rs. 100.00 per kVA of the contract demand for each billing period,
  - (ii) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 7.10 per unit for units consumed,
  - (iii) A fix charge of Rs. 800.00 per billing period.

#### Rate I.3 (S.T)

- (a) This rate shall apply to supplies on standby basis at each individual point of supply delivered and metered at 11,000 Volts nominal and above.
- (b) The charges in each billing period for supplies under this tariff shall be the sum of charge (i), (ii) and (iii) given below :—

- (i) A demand charge at the rate of Rs. 90.00 per kVA of the contract demand for each billing period,
- (ii) A unit charge at the basic rate of Rs. 7.10 per unit for units consumed,
- (iii) A fix charge of Rs. 800.00 per billing period.

#### Section 10

##### Street Lighting Tariff

This rate shall apply to supplies given for the purpose of Public Street lighting only.

The charges in each billing periods for energy supply under this tariff rate of Rs. 8.00 per unit.

#### Section 11

##### Deposit Against Electricity Consumption

The Ceylon Electricity Board may obtain from all its consumers a deposit equal to assessed cost of electricity consumption for two months, against electricity consumed.

#### Definitions and Clarifications

1. The charges in each billing period shall be based on the routine meter readings. where such readings have not been taken, assessments of the consumption shall be made by the General Manager of the Ceylon Electricity Board and used for computation of such charges.
2. When the date of commencement of supply is other than the normal routine meter reading date, the unit charge shall remain, as before while the maximum demand charge shall be levied on a pro-rata basis depending on the period after connection of supply.
3. The maximum demand in kilo Volt-Amperes (kVA) for any billing period shall, depending on the instrument used, be either—
  - (i) The highest number of Amperes registered by the demand indicator multiplied by the current transformer ratio and the declared voltage and divided by 1,000 ; or
  - (ii) The highest demand in kilo Volt-Amperes (kVA) recorded in the billing period as measured over successive periods of not less than 15 minutes.
  - (iii) In case the recorded maximum demand in kVA is not a whole number, the maximum demand chargeable shall be the next higher whole number in kVA.
4. The expression “Contract Demand” in kilo Volt-Amperes (kVA) means the total service capacity required by the consumer as declared in the original agreement or as subsequent varied, such contract demand being not less than the actual maximum demand made or likely to be made from time to time. The contract demand shall not be reduced from the agreed value until after the expiry of 12 months from the date of such agreement.
5. The “unit” used in the context of energy consumed, shall be kilo Watt-hour (kWh).

#### Miscellaneous Charges

##### 1. Installation Testing :

First testing of new installation and extension to installation	Free
Each addition testing, if first testing is unsatisfactory –	
Single phase installation	Rs. 1,000.00
Three phase installation	Rs. 1,500.00

##### 2. Retail meter Testing :

Testing meter at consumer's request	Rs. 620.00
(If the inaccuracy of the meter exceeds plus or minus 2.5% the fee will be refunded)	

3. *Charges for Delays in Payment of Bulk Supply Consumers*

- (i) Every consumer is given a credit of 15 days after issuing the bill.
- (ii) After the 15 days period, a monthly interest of 2% will be charges to the bill from the 16th day to recover the actual cost of not receiving the payment on time from the consumer.
- (iii) If a consumer fails to pay the bill and the interest thereon within the 30 day limit from the date of issuing the bill, a disconnection order will be issued and the supply will be disconnected forthwith.
- (iv) Even after the disconnection the monthly interest of 2% will continue to be charged on the outstanding amount.
- (v) Supply will e reconnected upon payment of 2% interest on the outstanding amount until the day of reconnection together with a reconnection processing fee of Rs. 800.00 and the outstanding amount.

4. *Charges for Delays in Payment of Ordinary Supply Consumers*

Ordinary Supply consumers will be given a credit period of 30 days after issuing the bill. After 30 days a monthly interest of 2% will be charged on the outstanding amount effective from the date of issuing the bill, if a disconnection order is issued. And if the supply is disconnected, a reconnection processing charge of Rs. 800.00 will be charged. The 2% interest is calculated on the total outstanding amount for half the period the bill is being outstanding. Supply will be reconnected only upon the payment of these charges together with the defaulted bill amount.

5. *Reconnection Fee after Disconnection at Consumer's Request :*

Reconnection the supply, after supply had been disconnected at the request of the same consumer, shall be Rs. 800.00.
