STATEMENT OF MATTER IN DISPUTE

The matters in dispute between the aforesaid parties are -

1. Whether the non absorption to the services of the Airport Authority of Mr. L. M. W. B. Kolugala who had been in service under the Department of Civil Aviation from 15/10/1976 at the time of converting the said Department as that Authority if not, to what relief he is entitled and,
2. Whether the denial of back wages and pension rights to Mr. L. M. W. B. Kolugala in consequence of reinstating him in service with effect from 15/10/1999 under the Airport and Aviation Services (Sri Lanka) Limited, on the basis that he had been earned all the salary increments and secured all grade to grade /promotions if not, to what relief he is entitled.
