UVA PROVINCE PROVINCIAL COUNCIL

Finance Statute No. 08 of 1990

ORDER UNDER SECTION 7

BY virtue of the powers vested in me under Section 7 (I) of the Finance Statute No. 08 of 1990 of the Uva Province Provincial Council, I, Gamini Wijith Wijayamuni Zoysa, Chief Minister and Minister of Finance, Planning, Law and Order, Local Government, Education, Transport, Cultural Affairs, Hindu Cultural Affairs, Tourism and Estate Infrastructure Affairs of the Uva Province Provincial Council, do, by this order, fix the following rates of Turnover Tax which shall come into effect from the midnight of 31st December 2004/01st January, 2005:-

- (a) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling Gold, Pearls, Gems, Precious or Semi-Precious Stones and Precious Metals ; 05 per centum
- (b) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling Jewellery and Costume Jewellery. 05 per centum
- (c) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling Timber, whether sawn or in the form of logs, Bamboos and Coconut-Timber. 05 per centum
- (d) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling Furniture (including Cabinets, Safes and Office Furniture) made out of Wood, Metal or Fibre-Glass. 05 per centum
- (e) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling Arrack (including processed Arrack and Blends of Arrack), Beer, Wine, Toddy and other varieties of imported or locally manufactured Liquor. 05 per centum
- (f) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling Cigarettes purchased from the manufacturer of such cigarettes or from the importer of such cigarettes. 05 per centum
- (g) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling the under-mentioned imported articles and commodities.
Ceramics, Ceramic Tiles, Bathroom and Toilet Fittings, Glass and Glassware. 05 per centum

- (h) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling the under-mentioned imported articles and commodities.

Cameras, Mobile Phones, Gymnastic Equipment, Refrigerators (including deep freezers, bottle coolers, water coolers, ice cream makers and other refrigerating articles), Air-Conditioners, Washing Machines, Radio Sets, Sound Recorders and Reproducers, Television Sets, Television Image and Sound Recorders and Reproducers and other electrical Machinery and equipment and accessories and parts of such articles.

- (i) In respect of the Turnover of the business of selling all mechanically propelled vehicles including Tractors or Trailors which are intended or adapted of use on roads, whether registered at the Department of Motor Traffic or not, (other than Mopeds, Motor Hearses, Invalid Carriages, Motor Tricycles which are constructed wholly or mainly for the carriage of persons and Buses having a seating capacity of over twenty six) Motor Cycles and mechanically operated vehicles, whether fitted with wheels or not, and machinery intended for use on land in connection with agricultural or constructional purposes such as levelling, dredging, earth-moving, forestry or any similar operation.

- (j) In respect of the Turnover of the business of buying and selling any article or commodity other than any business referred to under items (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), and (i) above.

The order made under this Section and published in the *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 647/2 of 28th January, 1991 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka and amendments thereto shall cease to apply, upon the coming into effect of this order, in respect of any turnover arising after the midnight of 31st December, 2004/01st January, 2005.
