to provide for the establishment of the Sri Lanka National Commission for the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO); and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto

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## L.D.-O 46/2008

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE SRI LANKA NATIONAL COMMISSION FOR THE UNITED NATIONS EDUCATIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND CULTURAL ORGANIZATION (UNESCO); AND FOR MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH OR INCIDENTAL THERETO

Be it enacted by the Parliament of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka as follows: -

**1.** This Act may be cited as the Sri Lanka National Short title Commission for UNESCO Act, No. ..... of 2022.

  - (*a*) to advice the Government of Sri Lanka on matters the Commission relating to UNESCO programmes and projects;
  - (b) to promote and disseminate among UNESCO beneficiaries in Sri Lanka an understanding of the objects, functions and purposes of UNESCO programmes and projects and to conduct meetings, seminars and lectures for that purpose;
  - (c) to work towards the achievement of the objects of the Commission with the co-operation of the relevant government and local autonomous bodies, international non governmental organizations, United Nations agencies, governmental and non governmental organizations, private and public sector institutions;
    - (*d*) to organize programmes in the fields of education, science, culture, mass media, communication and other relevant disciplines including programmes

  - (*k*) enter into and perform all such contracts as may be necessary for the exercise, performance and discharge of the powers, duties and functions of the Commission.

(3) All questions for decision at any meeting of the Commission shall be decided by the vote of the majority of members present and voting at such meeting. In the case of an equality of votes, the Chairperson shall, in addition to

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(4) The Commission shall meet at least once in every year. However, special or extraordinary general meetings may be convened, if and when required.

(5) Subject to the preceding provisions of this section, 15 the Commission may make rules to regulate the procedure in regard to the conduct of meetings of the Commission and the transaction of business at such meetings.

**11.** The Commission may act, notwithstanding any Acts or vacancy among its members, and any act or proceeding of proceedings 20 the Commission shall not be, or deemed to be, invalid by Commission reason only of the existence of any vacancy among its deemed not members or any defect in the appointment of a member to be invalid thereof.

(5) The members of every committee and experts appointed under subsection (1), shall be paid such allowances 15 and be reimbursed for any expenses incurred in connection

with the carrying out of any duties assigned, as the Commission may determine with the concurrence of the Minister assigned the subject of finance.

(6) The members of the committees may or may not be 20 permanent members of the Commission as the Commission may determine.

(7) The Commission may require a committee appointed under this section to act jointly or in cooperation with any other committee of the Commission.

- (a) the day to day operations of the Commission;

  - (d) the supervision and control of the officers and other staff of the commission.
- 25 (3) The Secretary General shall, submit for the consideration of the Minister, programmes and measures considered by him to be necessary for the purpose of exercising, performing and discharging the powers, duties and functions of the Commission.

(4) The Secretary General shall be entitled to be present, speak and vote, at any meeting of the Commission, or any other Committee established under this Act.

(5) The Secretary General shall ensure that sufficient 5 transparency is maintained in carrying out his duties and functions.

(6) The Secretary General shall submit to the Commission, the three years work plan, the annual plan and programme and the annual budget, for its concurrence.

- (7) The Secretary General may be paid such remuneration 10 in such manner and at such rates as may be determined by the Minister with the concurrence of the Minister assigned the subject of finance.

(4) The Commission may establish and regulate provident fund schemes for the benefit of the officers and servants of the Commission who may be recruited outside of the government service and may make contributions to any such scheme

### PART IV

### GENERAL

**27.** (1) The Minister may from time to time give such Directions of 30 general or special directions in writing to the Commission the Minister

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as to the exercise, perform and discharge the powers, duties and functions of the Commission and it shall be the duty of the Commission to comply with such directions.

(2) The Minister may from time to time, Order all or any 5 of the activities of the Commission to be investigated and reported upon by such person or persons as he may specify, and upon such Order being made, the Commission shall afford all such facilities and furnish all such information to such person or persons as may be necessary to give effect to

10 such Order.

28. The Commission shall, within a period of six months Commission after the closure of each financial year, submit a report giving report to be a full account of its activities during that year to the Minister who shall cause such report to be placed before Parliament,

15 prior to the end of the year next following the year to which such report relates.

29. All members of the Commission, officers and All members employees of the Commission shall be deemed to be public of the servants within the meaning and for the purpose of the Penal

20 Code (Chapter 19).

30. The Commission shall be deemed to be a Scheduled Commission Institution within the meaning of the Bribery Act deemed to be (Chapter 26) and the provisions of that Act shall be a Scheduled Institution construed accordingly.

31. (1) Any expense incurred by the Commission in Protection 25 any suit or prosecution brought by or against the for action Commission before any court shall be paid out of the Fund taken under of the Commission, and any costs paid to, or recovered by, the directions the Commission in any such suit or prosecution shall be of the 30 credited to the Fund of the Commission.

(2) Any expense incurred by any person in any suit or prosecution brought against him before any court in respect of any act which is done by him under this Act, or on the

- 5 **32.** (1) The Commission may make rules in respect Rules of-
  - (*a*) the appointment, employment and dismissal of officers and their powers, duties and functions;
  - (b) the procedure to be observed at the summoning and holding of meetings, annual general meeting and extraordinary meetings of the Commission;
  - (c) the administration and management of the affairs of the Commission;
  - (*d*) all matters in respect of which, rules are required or authorized to be made under this Act.

(2) Every rule made under subsection (1) shall be approved by the Minister.

(3) Every rule so approved shall be published in the *Gazette* and shall come into operation upon such publication.

20 **33.** (1) The Minister may make regulations in respect of Regulations all matters which are required by this Act to be prescribed or authorized to be made under this Act.

(2) Every regulation made by the Minister shall be published in the *Gazette*, and shall come into operation on25 the date of such publication or on such later date as may be specified in the regulation.

(3) Every regulation made by the Minister shall, within three months from its publication in the *Gazette*, be brought before Parliament for approval. Any such regulation, which

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is not so approved shall be deemed to be rescinded as from the date of such disapproval, but without prejudice to anything previously done thereunder.

(4) Notification of the date on which any regulation is5 deemed to be rescinded under subsection (3), shall be published in the *Gazette*.

34. In this Act, unless the context otherwise required:- Interpretation

"expert" means a professional with specialized competence in any one of the areas of UNESCO programmes;

- "Minister" means the Minister assigned the subject of Education under Article 44 or 45 of the Constitution;
- "UNESCO" means United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization;
- "UNESCO Programmes" means the five UNESCO areas of competence and includes Education, Natural Sciences, Social and Human Sciences, Culture and Communication and Information.
- 20 **35.** In the event of any inconsistency between the Sinhala text Sinhala and Tamil texts of this Act, the Sinhala text shall to prevail in prevail.
