ANIMAL DISEASES ACT, No. 59 OF 1992

Proclamation

WHEREAS foot and mouth Disease has broken out among cattles in Kundasale and Medamahanuwara Divisional Secretary Divisions in Kandy District of the Central Province, I, Alawaththage Don Nimal Chandrasiri, the Director General of the Animal production and Health by virtue of the powers vested in me under the Animal disease Act, No. 59 of 1992, do hereby declare the area within the following boundaries as an "infected area".

East : Western border of Ududhumbara Divisional Secretary Division;

West : South-East border of Pahathadhumbara Divisional Secretary Division and North-East border

of Gangawatakorale Divisional Secretary Division;

North: Southern border of Panwila Divisional Secretary Division;

South: North-East border of Pahathahewahatta Divisional Secretary Division and Northern border of

Hanguranketha Divisional Secretary Division.

Under regulation 5(3), I, Alawaththage Don Nimal Chandrasiri the Director General of the Animal Production and Health do hereby proclaim that no movement of cattle or cart traffic from and to this area shall be allowed, until this proclamation is revoked.

The attention of cattle owners and carters in this area is drawn to the Animal Diseases Act, No. 59 of 1992 which lays down the action which persons are by law required to take in an "Infected Area" Details of these regulations can be obtained from the government Veterinary Surgeons at Kundasale and Teldeniya and the Divisional Secretaries.

This proclamation shall take effect from the date hereof.
