**POLICY STATEMENT OF URBAN AGRICULTURE - WESTERN PROVINCE**

1. Development of ecofriendly urban agriculture activities through the appropriate use of new and traditional technologies, to enhance the income and improve living standards of urban people.
2. Strengthening urban agricultural activities by developing strong links with the government, private non-government organizations, international government and non-government organizations as well as civil organizations.
3. In the practice of urban agriculture, engage in ecofriendly activities like recycling of water and waste, rainwater harvesting and efficient use of urban resources.



4. Utilize all types of available land effectively for the promotion of urban agriculture. These could range from household premises to unused government and private land.

5. Develop award schemes, credit facilities and insurance services for urban agricultural activities and enterprises, as incentives.

6. Integrating urban agriculture with novel concepts like agri-tourism schemes.

7. Including urban agriculture in the syllabuses of primary, secondary and tertiary educational institutions.

8. Make provisions for exchange of local and foreign knowledge and experiences towards enhancing urban agriculture in the country, as well as developing facilitation skills and attitudes towards practice.

9. Urban agriculture development requires the encouragement and facilitation of new research activities.

10. Effective use of the mass media is vital for urban agricultural development.
