(01). The following new schedule will replace the Fifth Schedule to the Explosives Orders of 1979 as amended by *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 1985/37 dated 23.09. 2016 and published by *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 23/5 dated 13.02.1979

- (a) 500m of safety fuses should be concerned as an one Kilogram
- (b) 500 detonators should be concerned as an one Kilogram
- (c) 500 metres of detonator code should be concerned as an one Kilogram
- (d) 250 ammunitions should be concerned as an one Kilogram

(03). The following new schedule will replace the schedule specifying the relevant fees for clearance permits for dangerous cargo items given in paragraph 08 in the fifth schedule to the 1979 Explosives Ordinance, published in the *Extraordinary Gazette* No. 23/ 5 dated 13.02.1979, as amended by the *Extraordinary Gazette* No. 2257/32 dated 08.12.2021.
