Implementation of a programme that provides facilities including required proper nutrition and training to identify children who are talented in sports in rural schools spread across the island from early age and bring their skills to international level.</p> <p>5. Implementation of a special programme to produce resource persons such as sports counselors, coaches and physiotherapists required for the development of sports.</p> <p>6. Development of playgrounds and pavilions all over the island in accordance with accepted standardization.</p> <p>7. Distribution of required equipment and goods for the development of rural sports.</p> <p>8. Preparation of a programme for the advancement of local traditional sports.</p> <p>9.
